








## What is known from Cambodia compared to neighbouring countries?



#### Lanternflies (Fulgoridae)

- Cambodia: 5 species
- Thailand: 17 species
- Vietnam: 29 species



# Why is Cambodian fauna so poorly documented?

Khmer rouge period: 1975-1979



- •About 2,000,000 people dead
- •About 6,000,000 landmines












# What if we use internet for collecting data?

#### Results of Facebook – Internet research




- 18 persons collaborated (FB: 12)
- 38 original data in 59 photos
- 31 data from FB only
- 15 species documented
- data dating back to 2009
- 4 species known from CS only





### Results of Facebook – Internet research



#### Benefits of citizens' involvement



- Improvement of scientific knowledge
- Better documentation of distribution and phenology
- Motivation of the participants




#### Limits of the method



- Only possible for species which can be identified on photographs
- Implication of a taxonomist from the beginning of the process requires time
- Quality and speed of the feedback to the participants
